\*\*In addition to CORE 145F, FREN 231, FREN 233, and FREN 480, all students majoring in French/ Education are required to take a French Literature Course (FREN 235, FREN 341, FREN 342 or an appropriate FREN 491) and three (3) additional French Major Courses to satisfy the twenty-four (24) French credits required for the major. *(Keep in mind that upper-level French Major Courses are offered on a rotating basis. So, choose the course when it is offered).* Choose from the list below:

<sup>2</sup>Updated Clearance Packets **REQUIRED** for EDUC 235, EDUC 240, EDUC 270, EDUC 304, EDUC 305, EDUC 350, EDUC 366, EDUC 467 and EDUC 468.

<sup>3</sup>All teacher certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English. CORE 110 and CORE 16\_\_ satisfy the certification requirement for English. For the six credit Math requirement, students should strongly consider taking MATH 101 and MATH 102 in place of CORE 120. The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for the King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.

<sup>5</sup> EDUC 299 Basic Skills is a pre-requisite for all 300 and 400 level education courses. In order to register for this course, you must take and pass all basic skills tests.

<sup>6</sup>In addition to the above requirements, teacher certification candidates in French must take the ACTFL (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Language) Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) prior to student teaching. In order to receive certification, these candidates must achieve a score of Advanced Low or above. For certification, candidates must also either pass the Fundamental Subjects Test or take the ACTFL Written Proficiency Test (in addition to the OPI) and receive a score of Intermediate High on the WPT.

**NOTE:** All Teacher Certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English:

Must apply for formal acceptance to the Education Department after completing a minimum of 6 credits at King's College and no later than the semester prior to student teaching.

Certification in Pennsylvania requires the candidate to maintain a 3.0 GPA and complete the necessary testing requirements.
