<sup>4</sup> All secondary teacher certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English. CORE 110 and CORE 16\_\_ satisfy the secondary certification requirement for English. For the six credit Math requirement, students should strongly consider taking MATH 101 and MATH 102 in place of CORE 120. The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.

<sup>5</sup> Updated Clearance Packets **REQUIRED** for EDUC 235, EDUC 240, EDUC 270, EDUC 303, EDUC 305, EDUC 350, EDUC 366, EDUC 467 and EDUC 468.

<sup>6</sup> EDUC 299 Basic Skills is a pre-requisite for all 300 and 400 level education courses. In order to register for this course, you must take and pass all basic skills tests.

**NOTE:** All Secondary Teacher Certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English:

Must apply for formal acceptance to the Education Department after completing a minimum of 6 credits at King's College and no later than the semester prior to student teaching.

Certification in Pennsylvania requires the candidate to maintain a 3.0 GPA and complete the necessary testing requirements.
